NOTICE TO MANUFACTURERS

REGARDING 1996 RULES CHANGES

As a result of the usual quadrennial revision, the 1996 Rules Book will contain some Rules changes. None of these will have any significant effect on club or ball designers. The changes are mostly clarifications of the Rules and of how they have been and are interpreted. The complete revised version of Rule 4 and 5, and Appendix II and III are enclosed.

Specific instances of changes that have been made include, but are not limited to, the following:

Pre	em	To avoid repetition in individual rules, a paragraph has been added aphasizing that intent in design of a club may be just as important as a actuality of the finished product.
4-1		A putter loft may not exceed 10 degrees.
4-1		A club must have no external attachments.
4-1		The grip must extend to the end of the shaft.
Appendix	I	
4-1	the no	In the normal address position, the shaft must not diverge from the rtical in the face back plane by more than 20°. The 10° minimum in the toe heel plane remains, and has been extended to apply to all clubs, at just putters. Also, the methods of making various measurements are parified.
4-1	c - 1	A grip may have a slightly indented spiral replicating a wrapped grip.
4-1	e - I	Under "Impact Area and Material" - Surface roughness of the face ust not exceed decorative sandblasting or fine milling. Also, the apact area must be of a single material.
4-1	e - l sp	Under "Non-Metallic Club Face Markings" - The marking ecifications apply to materials that are similar in hardness to metal, g., ceramics.

Appendix III - The Ball

Section C - The actual symmetry test has been removed from the text of the rule.

That test may still be used to advise the manufacturers if the ball is not symmetrical.

The illustrations have been updated to better depict the meaning of the text, and some new illustrations have been added. Also, manufacturers are encouraged to submit products prior to manufacture and marketing, even if they do not have any reasonable basis for doubt as to whether or not the product conforms to the Rules; the preamble to Rule 4 has been modified to achieve this purpose.
